Wounded Warrior Games

The 2019 DoD Wounded Warrior Games are coming to Tampa on June 21-30, 2019 and is being hosted by the US Special Operations Command (SOCOM) from MacDill AFB. In 2011, AFA created the Wounded Airman Program (WAP) with the focus of Airmen taking care of Airmen. The Air Force Association, as part of the WAP, will be hosting a Hospitality Tent during the swimming events, which are being held at the Long Aquatic Center in Clearwater on Saturday, June 29. The Hospitality area will provide an area for wounded warrior competitors from all services, and their caregivers and families, to relax. The Waterman-Twining Chapter is supporting the Hospitality Tent by providing volunteers to man the Hospitality area, coordinating with the Support the Troops organization to deliver water and snacks, providing fresh fruit from Publix, and books and games for the children.

Honor Flight



Honor Flight (HF) of West Central Florida is a 501C(3), national organization in 46 states and has over 120 hubs/chapters. Their mission is to identify veterans and transport them to Washington, D.C. to see the Memorials built in their honor and to give them the welcome home many never received. The one day trip is FREE. Flights leave from Clearwater/St. Petersburg (PIE) Airport at 4 AM and fly to Baltimore Washington International (BWI) Airport. Veterans (approximately 70) and a like number of guardians/ escorts (each veteran has a guardian/escort) are transported from BWI by three commercial buses to the Air Force, Lincoln, Korean, Vietnam and WW II Memorials. Veterans return to PIE approximately 8:30 PM the same day. Since the local hub's inception in 2010, 2,800 veterans from the Tampa Bay area have participated in the flights. Two flights were flown this spring and two more are scheduled this fall - Sept 10 and Oct 22. Veterans can retrieve an application via the HF's web site: Honorflightwcf.org and mail it to the P. O. Box identified on the application. It's an indescribable experience. Questions can be directed to 727-498-6079

Tricare Update:

Beginning with the 2018 Federal Benefits Open Season (11/12-12/10) beneficiaries enrolled in a Tricare health plan will be eligible to enroll in the Federal Employees Dental & Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP). Coverage will start Jan 1, 2019.

Beneficiaries enrolled in or eligible for the Tricare Retiree Dental Program (TRDP) will also be able to enroll in one of the FEDVIP dental options for 2019 coverage. TRDP will end 12/31. If you are currently enrolled in the TRDP plan, you will not be automatically enrolled in a FEDVIP plan for 2019.
